

STUDENT DROP OFF

Dropping Off Students

If you drop off your child in the morning, please be sure to use the designated drop off zone. Children should be let out of the vehicle at the "Student Drop Off and Pick Up Area" sign in front of the crosswalk. If there is a line of cars, please wait in the line until you are able to pull up to the drop off spot. This will prevent children from walking between cars where a driver may not be able to see them.

A teacher's aide will stand at the crosswalk and outside the building door each day from 8:00 to 8:25 a.m. to greet and assist your child. After 8:25 a.m. your student must enter through the front entrance.

Please do not drive your car into the bus loop in front of the building to drop off your child before 8:25 a.m. Only buses are allowed in the loop during this time.

Dropping Off Students After School Starts

If you arrive after 8:25 a.m. you may pull up to the main entrance to drop off your child once buses and children have been cleared. Please accompany your child to the front lobby so you can let Ms. Fazioli know why your student is late.

Please No Parking in Bus Loop

Please do not park your vehicle in the bus loop. The only exception is when you are walking your student to the front lobby when he or she is late. For the safety of everyone in the school, it is imperative this area be kept clear at all times for emergency vehicles.

Please Drive Carefully

For the safety of our students, we ask all visitors to please take extra caution when driving on school grounds. The drop off location, parking lot and bus loop can get quite busy so please adhere to the 15 MPH speed limit and watch carefully for students. It is illegal to pass a stopped school bus when its signal lights are flashing.

Signed Note Required for Change in Transportation

If you need to change transportation for your student, please send a signed note in the morning with your child. It should contain:

- Child's Name
- Grade Level
- Date
- Address they will be going to
- Name of person picking up your child (if applicable)

Calls to the Main Office during the day to change transportation arrangements are for emergencies only. These calls should be made before noon to allow time to coordinate with a child's teacher and the Transportation Department.

Early Release Requests

If your student needs to be excused early from school, please submit a written request to the Main Office before the start of school. Parents are required to pick up students at the Main Office and sign them out for early dismissal.

School Bus Safety

To ensure the safety of students, it is important that parents review the following bus safety rules with their children.

- Students must sit in seats at all times while riding the bus.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed while riding the bus.
- Talking loudly or making noise that could distract the bus driver should be avoided.
- All rules described in the district's Code of Conduct should be followed.

If these rules are violated repeatedly, a student may be suspended from school transportation. Parents would then be responsible for transporting their child to and from school each day, per New York State Education Law.

HEALTH SERVICES

Who Do I Contact If My Child Will Miss School or Will Be Late?

If your child will be absent or late, please call the Health Office at (518) 283-4600 ext. 18 by 8:30 a.m. This number may be called at any time, day or night. If we do not hear from you, School Nurse Tricia Gibbs will call you to ensure your child is safe and accounted for. Please send a note with the date and reason for your child's absence when your child returns to school.

If Your Child Is Sick

If your child is sick, they should be fever-free without medication for 24 hours before returning to school. The same rule applies to vomiting. If your child has vomited within the last 24 hours, they should stay at home. Please help us keep everyone healthy!

Student Emergency Contact Forms

Each year, a Student Emergency Contact form is sent to parents and guardians for updating. It is critical that parents take the time to update this information for all their children so the school can contact parents or guardians in case of an emergency.

The information provided is used for our automated emergency calling system, which is used to contact parents during an emergency. The information on this form also stipulates where your child will be dropped off in the event of an emergency closing. Pick up at school during emergencies will not be available as our goal is to evacuate students as quickly as possible.

Any changes throughout the school year must be sent in writing to your child's teacher.

Medication Administration in School

Please be reminded that students are not to transport or carry medications with them in school. This includes both prescription and non-prescription medications (such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen, etc.).

All medications must be brought to school by a parent/guardian, or another adult they designate. The medication will then be kept secure in the Health Office.

A doctor's order and written permission from a parent are required for medication administration in school. Please call the health office for the recommended form. A doctor and parent may write their own.


There are exceptions, such as an inhaler or EpiPen, in which the doctor determines the student needs to carry it with them at all times. In such cases, the doctor and parent will need to provide written documentation that this is necessary. The student must be capable to carry the responsibility of caring for, and self-administering the medication. A doctor's order and parent permission are still required.

HEALTH SERVICES

Student Athletes

All students need to be approved/cleared to play school sports by the school medical director prior to tryouts. Paperwork for student athletes must be handed in by the first day of try outs/practices. Physicals must be dated within one year of that date, and Health Histories are required within 30 days of the start of each sport season. New Health Histories are required for each sport. These forms are available at www.wynantskillufsd.org or the Health Office.

Concussion Information

Any student athlete who is believed to have sustained a concussion must be immediately removed from all athletic activities. The student cannot participate in athletic activity until they have been symptom free for 24 hours and have been evaluated by a licensed physician. For more information, including parent resources, about concussions, visit the Health Office webpage on the district website.

Mandated Health Screenings

The State of New York mandates that health related screening be completed in our schools each year. The requirements are as follows:

- Vision Screening: All new students and students in kindergarten and grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7.
- Hearing Screening: All new students and students in kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, and 7.
- Scoliosis: Girls only in grades 5 and 7.

If there are any usual findings, or cause for concern, the school nurse will contact you. In the event that additional evaluation is needed, a referral form will be sent home for you to take to your private healthcare provider.

Physicals

New York State Law requires that mandatory physicals be completed BEFORE students enter pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5 and 7. Physicals must also be completed for all new students to the district. In order to remain in school, any student who does not have a completed physical when entering these grades will be scheduled for a school physical.

Many parents prefer to have their own physician do the exam. A private physician provides the extra benefit of not only consulting with the parent on the child's growth and development, but can also provide the needed immunizations and follow-up care. Reports of physical exams done by private physicians must be dated within 1 year previous to the start of the school year, and no later than 30 days after entering school.

The school district also provides this service by our School Health Provider during the school year. Students who do not have a physical exam on file in the Health Office will be scheduled for the exam in school.

Sports physicals must be reviewed and signed by the school physician before a student is cleared for sports. This will be done when the school doctor is scheduled to come in prior to each season. It is very important that physicals be done by that time. The signing of these physicals will be handled through the Health Office.

Also, before entering grade 6, students must have verification from a doctor of either having had chicken pox or receiving the varicella vaccine.



IPM relies on a combination of common sense practices such as sanitation, good housekeeping, engineering controls and current information on the life cycles of pests and their interactions with the environment to manage pest damage by the most cost-effective means but with the least hazard to person, property and the environment. IPM programs take advantage of pest management options, including non-chemical alternatives and discreet use of pesticides.
