- 2.1 Board of Education Reports & Updates
 - Mark Lacavita, North Greenbush Planning Board Chairperson Mr. Lacavita provided the Board of Education with an overview of the Planning Boards roles and responsibilities.
- 2.2 District / Superintendent Program Report
 - Dr. Reardon provided the following information to the BOE:
 - a. Budget Advocacy: March 5, 2019 Capital Region Superintendents were able to meet with Assemblymember John T. McDonald III to express their concerns with State Aide.
 - b. Evacuation Drill: March 8, 2019 408 students and 60 staff members evacuated and relocated to St. Jude's the Apostle School. The entire drill took around 45 minutes.

- c. Odyssey of the Mind: March 9, 2019 Dr. Reardon was able to be a judge for the event. One middle school team at Gardner-Dickinson took second place.
