District Plans for Enhancements and Expansions to Services

A community vote on Wynantskill UFSD's 2022-23 budget will take place Tuesday, May 17 from noon - 9 p.m. in the Gardner-Dickinson School. The polls will be open to vote by voting machine. The 2022-23 school budget totals \$10,380,611 and requires a 2.10% tax levy increase.

The district successfully navigated through the ongoing pandemic by overcoming obstacles together as a community and providing our students with in-person instruction 5 days per week for the last 2 years. This is a huge accomplishment to be recognized and commended.

The Proposed Budget for the 2022-2023 school year reflects the district's plan, in hopes of pivoting away from COVID, to spend our resources with a greater focus on enhancing and expanding our academic and social emotional resources.

We are excited to announce that the district has made provisions to expand our preschool program, adding a second section in order to capture all eligible students this fall. This expansion utilizes NYS grants to expand preschool opportunities and provides early interventions to our most impressionable students.

By maximizing State and Federal Aid/Grants and securing last year's allocations from the Coronavirus Relief and American Rescue Plan Acts, the district will purchase new English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum and materials and fund professional development to implement the new program with fidelity. "The Fountas and Pinnell Classroom will be a wonderful enhancement to our balanced literacy program giving teachers the opportunity to provide individualized explicit instruction to ALL of our students no matter where they are performing," Principal Suzann Cornell.

The district recognizes the importance of giving our students the social and emotional supports needed to overcome the many challenges we have faced during the last two years. This budget provides additional supports for our students by increasing the social worker from 2 to 3 days per week. A full time psychologist, guidance counselor and an SEL consultant from Questar III will provide continued supports. "We want to ensure that ALL students have access to a provider who can meet their social and emotional needs but also want to work proactively and help to create a culture of acceptance and strong relationships in every classroom, for every student." Dr. Mary Yodis

Other provisions in the 2022-23 budget include increased offerings for after-school tutoring in the Middle School, increased supports for our Special Education programs and supervision, maintaining current technology, and increases in the transportation department including funding for longevity incentives, fuel expenses, and maintenance and repair costs.



The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2022-23 by the qualified voters of the Wynantskill Union Free school district, Rensselaer County, New York, will be held at Gardner-Dickinson school in said district on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 between the hours of Noon and 9:00 p.m., at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine.

PROPOSITION #1, the 2022-2023 Budget:

Shall the Board of Education of the Wynantskill Union Free School District, Rensselaer County, New York be authorized to expend the total amount of \$10,380,611.00 during the school year 2022-2023 and to levy the necessary tax, therefore.

PROPOSITION #2, the 2022-23 Bus Proposal:

Shall the Board of Education of the Wynantskill Union Free School District, Rensselaer County, New York be authorized to (1) up to two SCHOOL BUSES, at a maximum aggregate cost of \$179,165.00 (2) expend such sum, or so much thereof as shall be necessary; and (3) shall be paid from the current appropriation.
