# District Plans for Safety Enhancements and Expansions to Services

A community vote on Wynantskill UFSD's 2023-24 budget will take place Tuesday, May 16 from noon - 9 p.m. in the Gardner-Dickinson School. The polls will be open to vote by voting machine. The 2023-24 school budget totals 10,546,565 and requires a 2.13% tax levy increase.

During this year, our district pivoted its focus from the ongoing challenges brought on by the pandemic to building back and strengthening our academic, social and emotional programming and support services. We have been extremely successful as we have added new or enhanced existing curriculum materials in all content areas PreK-8, provided students with multi-tiered academic and emotional supports, and worked with the PTA to provide clubs, field trips and afterschool activities which promote personal well-being as well as a strong school community. We look forward to continuing this great work next year through the proposed budget for the 2023-24 school year.

During the last 2 years, the district used a large portion of its Coronavirus Relief and American Rescue Plan Acts allocations to purchase new English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum along with providing the professional development to implement the new program with fidelity. The funding also allowed us the opportunity to hire a part-time social worker to provide emotional supports to our students and their families in need. The district will continue to support both crucial initiatives through next year's budget.

A new and very important addition to the 2023-24 budget is welcoming a full-time School Resource Officer in our school daily. The district is working with the Rensselaer County Sheriff's Department to obtain an active officer at Gardner-Dickinson to start in September.

"Our district will always make the safety of our students and staff our top priority. Sadly, we recognize the difficult times we are now facing with such an increase in school violence. We will ensure that safety remains at the forefront of everything we do so that we can continue to thrive as a school community," says Dr. Yodis

Other provisions in the 2023-24 budget include maintaining current technology with 1:1 devices and innovations such as zSpace virtual reality; offerings for after-school academic, social, and sports clubs; and increases in salaries and longevity incentives for our bus drivers.

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2023-24 by the qualified voters of the Wynantskill Union Free School District, Rensselaer County, New York, will be held at the Gardner-Dickinson School in said district on Tuesday, May 16, 2023 between the hours of Noon and 9:00pm, prevailing time, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine.

## PROPOSITION #1: THE 2023-24 BUDGET

Shall the Board of Education of the Wynantskill Union Free School District, Rensselaer County, New York be authorized to expend the total amount of \$10,546,565 during the school year 2023-2024 and to levy the necessary tax therefore.

## PROPOSITION #2: THE 2023-24 BUS PROPOSAL

Shall the Board of Education of the Wynantskill Union Free School District, Rensselaer County, New York be authorized to (1) acquire one SCHOOL BUS, at a maximum aggregate cost of \$146,000.00 (2) expend such sum, or so much thereof as shall be necessary; and (3) shall be paid from the current appropriation.

# **BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTION**

Voters will elect candidates to fill two (2) open seats on the Board of Education. One is a three (3) year term and the other is a partial, one-year-term to fill the remaining term of a board member who resigned this past year. The individual who receives the most votes will fill the three-year term, the individual who receives the second most votes will fill the one-year term. The following incumbent candidate will be listed on the ballot: Eric Strang, Nichole Hurbanek.

#### **ERIC STRANG**
